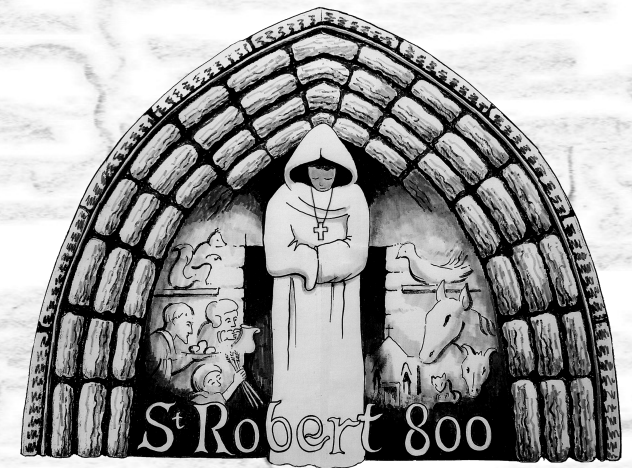
3. What animal did St. Robert tame for use on the farm?

How will you respond?

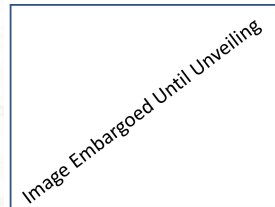
The audio experience can be purchased and downloaded from www.strobertofknaresborough.org.uk - and the walk starts from Castlegate Books in the Market Square.

The St. Robert Art Trail

STOP 1: Knaresborough's newest Town Window will be unveiled at 11.30 on Saturday 11th August - if you missed the unveiling then start your trail at any time in the Market Square and with your back to the Market Cross look toward the library. St. Robert will be there with outstretched hands...



STOP 2: Return to the Market Cross and proceed toward Gracious Street and on to Holy Trinity Church (you'll find it on the FEVA map). On loan for a limited period from the Mercer Gallery in Harrogate is a portrait of St. Robert. The painter is unknown, and of course the image is how that painter imagined him.



If you look behind the alter on the east wall you'll see another picture of Robert along with two other northern saints, Columba of Iona and Wilfrid of Ripon. If you look carefully you should spot the deliberate mistake!

STOP 3: Take a walk down Abbey Road (perhaps to a Saint Appointments recording) where a new wood carving of St. Robert nestles in the shrubbery in a welcoming pose...



STOP 4: In the comfort of your own home you can also visit the St. Robert website's image gallery where you can see pictures of other art work from St. Robert's Church in Harrogate and the stained glass windows from St. Matthew's Church at Morley in Derbyshire.
